PURPOSE STATEMENT

JOHNSON & WALES UNIVERSITY Providence Campus SAFETY & SECURITY

The Department of Campus Safety & Security promotes the success of the university's mission by fostering a safe, inclusive and vibrant community.

CAMPUS SAFETY & SECURITY PATROL

Campus Safety & Security uses four patrol methods 24 hours a day, seven days a week:

Foot

Provides officers the opportunity to walk with and interact with students, faculty and staff.

Bicycle

Similar to foot patrol with extra mobility, particularly in the Downcity area.

Vehicle

Most effective presence of Campus Safety & Security. Patrols cover both campuses and various university properties outside the central campus locations.

Virtual Patrol

Officers use cameras located in public areas of the campus to conduct virtual patrols.

Campus Safety & Security also uses a student auxiliary to monitor the parking lots on the Harborside Campus as well as in the Downcity office to greet guests and assist with office duties.

BLUE LIGHT PHONES

Blue light emergency phones are strategically located throughout the Downcity and Harborside campuses. The phones are connected to Campus Safety &



Security's 24-hour communications center. The phones can be used to report emergencies, suspicious activity and crimes.



PARKING PERMITS

Parking permits for day school students are handled solely by Student Academic & Financial Services. Resident and commuter students who plan to bring a vehicle on university property (with the exception of the JWU garage) must register their vehicle with the office upon arrival. Students will need to know their license plate number to apply for any parking permit.

All payments for parking permits are made through the office of Student Financial Services (SFS) online via **pvdparking.afford.com** or in person at their location on Pine Street (Downcity Campus), or the first floor of the Friedman Center (Harborside Campus). Permits can be picked up 24 hours after purchase at either the Downcity or Harborside SFS office.

Commuter students that park only in the JWU garage will be issued a free permit, which is available at the garage office.

CAMPUS SAFETY & SECURITY SERVICES

Valuables are engraved with a number which is entered into a database with the owner's information. Anyone with questions or interest in this service should contact the Crime Prevention Unit at 598-2947.

Safe Walk

This is a student escort service for faculty, staff and students on campus. Anyone in need of assistance should call Campus Safety & Security at 598-1103 to arrange an escort.

Self-defense Awareness & Familiarization Exchange (SAFE)

SAFE is an educational awareness, crime-victim prevention program for teenaged and adult women that encompasses strategies, techniques and options that may reduce their risk of exposure to violence.

Lost and Found

Lost items are held at Campus Safety & Security for 90 days. Students may inquire about lost items at any time. Items can be picked up at the Downcity Campus Safety & Security office.

CPR/First Aid

Campus Safety & Security has certified instructors on staff and offers classes in American Red Cross™ Adult CPR, Child/Infant CPR, AED (automatic external defibrillator) and first aid.

Anyone interested in scheduling a class should contact crimeprevention@jwu.edu to find out when the next class is being held or how to organize a class for their group.

REPORTING SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

When you see something, say something! Campus Safety & Security strives to keep the JWU campus and community safe at all times. If you witness a crime or questionable incident, please notify us immediately at 598-1103. Officers and staff are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to assist.

Silent Witness Program

While it is preferable for students to file reports in person to Campus Safety & Security, we recognize there are times when students do not report concerns for various reasons or wish to remain anonymous. Visit **safety.jwu.edu/ providence** for more information.

Crime Alerts

Incidents requiring timely notification to the university community are emailed to the campus community, posted on bulletin boards and in jwuLink. Crime alerts are also published in the *Campus Herald* and at **alerts.jwu.edu/ providence**.

When there is an imminent threat to the campus community, the university will immediately make notification through its emergency notification system to include text messages, phone calls, emails and Twitter.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL OFFENSES

Possession or use of alcoholic beverages anywhere on university property is prohibited except for legal use at



events, operations, programs, premises or facilities sanctioned by the university. Violations will be reported to Student Conduct. Possession of illegal drugs will be reported to law enforcement officials. Visit **catalog.jwu.edu/handbook** for more information and to review the information.



G^{OO}O Neighbor POLICY

All students living in the community need to remember they represent Johnson & Wales, and their conduct reflects directly on the university. Families living in the neighborhoods around our campuses have the right to enjoy a reasonable level of peace and quiet. Many times students' academic and personal schedules conflict with the more routine schedules of families. CRIME PREVENTION

Campus Safety & Security offers a variety of crime prevention programs designed to increase the level of security on campus including:

Alcohol Awareness

Working with the university health education coordinator, Campus Safety & Security officers show students how alcohol affects the body using Fatal Vision® goggles. Student volunteers perform everyday tasks — both with and without the goggles — which gives them a first-hand look at how alcohol affects a person's actions and reactions.

Sexual Assault Awareness

In collaboration with the sexual assault prevention coordinator, Campus Safety & Security officers teach students how to minimize their chances of becoming victims of sexual assault. Students also learn about the resources available if they (or a friend) should be a victim of an assault.

Identity Theft

Students learn the various ways identity information is stolen and what can occur when it's stolen, along with tips on what students can do if someone is using their personal information illegally.

Laptop Security

Students learn the value of their laptops to thieves, what common tactics are employed to steal them and steps to prevent theft.

Property Protection

Property protection complements the project ID program and is designed to increase students' awareness of practices used by thieves on campus and how to minimize the risk of becoming victims.



Residence Hall Security

This program educates students on safeguarding their valuables while living in the residence halls, covers general security issues (including locking dorm room doors) and explains why education is important to everyone's safety.

Street Smarts

An educational tool for members of the university community, Street Smarts shows students how to reduce the opportunity for a crime to occur. The program is based on individuals making a P.A.C.T. with themselves. P.A.C.T. is an acronym for Planning, Alertness, Confidence and Trust. One must **Plan** where they are going, be **Alert** to their surroundings, walk with **Confidence** and **Trust** their instincts.

Campus Outreach

The Campus Safety & Security outreach officer hosts events including pizza parties during the academic year to engage students and promote a partnership between them and Campus Safety & Security.

SECURITY IN RESIDENCE HALLS

All university housing is provided with 24-hour monitored access with direct access limited to its residents. All guests visiting traditional residential halls must sign in and out on the visitor's log at the front desk.

The university also reserves the right to inspect and search residents' rooms in the event that a violation of the Student Code of Conduct occurs or is believed to have occurred.

The security and safety of our campus is the responsibility of the entire JWU community. Students, faculty and staff are important elements in the reporting of unusual incidents, persons and conditions.

ID CARDS

ID cards are issued to all enrolled students and must be carried at all times. The cards enable students to attend universitysponsored events, gain access to residence halls, the library, computer facilities, athletic facilities and the bookstores, receive meals in the dining halls, and use university buses.

Report lost or stolen ID cards to Campus Safety & Security (401-598-1103) and do not permit someone to use your ID. Do not allow someone to "tailgate" into a university building unless you are absolutely certain the person is a member of the university community.

IDENTITY THEFT

No matter how well you may protect the way your personal information is distributed, skilled identity thieves use both high- and low-tech means to capture your information. If you think you have been a victim of identity theft, take the following steps:

- 2. Contact the creditors for any accounts that are fraudulently opened or tampered with.
 - 3. Report the incident to Campus Safety & Security and the local police.



Emergency Management directs and coordinates the university's emergency management function to provide effective crisis preparedness, response, mitigation and recovery measures.

National Incident Management System

Members of our crisis management teams receive National Incident Management System (NIMS) training and participate in drills and exercises with local emergency service providers in the campus area. Each team also has emergency communication capability through Johnson & Wales University's emergency notification system. This multi-contact emergency message system allows us to send important emergency instructions to all students, staff, and faculty simultaneously. The system uses all the contact phone numbers provided by our students during registration for classes.



Emergency Procedures

Effective emergency response requires the coordinated efforts of students, staff and faculty. Each member of the Johnson & Wales community should be prepared to act promptly when faced with an emergency. The Emergency Management Plan contains procedures pertaining to situations such as building evacuations, shelter-in-place and lockdown.



Emergency Siren Warning System

Johnson & Wales University Providence Campus has an Emergency Siren Warning System (ESWS) on the Harborside Campus, which is also part of the Port of Providence Emergency Siren Warning System. The siren is strategically located to provide lifethreatening emergency messages to the campus community and nearby neighbors if an imminent threat situation should occur in the area. Activations will consist of an alert tone followed by a voice message regarding the nature of the emergency.
