Packing Checklist

How Big is Your Bed?

Cedar Halls North & South are equipped with twin XL beds. Bed risers are not permitted in Cedar Hall North & South, but bed frames can be adjusted for extra space.



What is Included in Your Room?

- 2 Twin XL Beds
- 2 Desks
- 2 Desk Chairs
- 2 Dressers
- 2 Closets
- Window with Window Shade
- Wi-Fi
- MicroFridge (combination microwave and minirefrigerator/freezer)

The day has finally come to move into your new home away from home! We want to make this a fun and stress-free day to kick off the semester. Our move-in process will take place over two days, one day for new residents and one day for returning residents. The check-in process will be broken up into two parts: a centralized check-in and moving into your housing assignment. Each resident is only permitted to have 3 guests assist during the move-in period. Guests are not permitted to stay overnight.

Registering for Check-In

We will require that each resident register for a move-in time slot. You can select a move-in time through the Wildcat Housing System in your 2022-2023 Housing application.

Early check-in must be requested and approved by the Office of Residential Life. The Early Arrival Form has been emailed to residents.



2 Checking In

Friday, August 26th: The housing check-in process will be located in Parking Lot A. To check-in, you will need to:

- 1. Arrive 15 minutes prior to your registered move-in time.
- 2.Enter the parking lot from <u>South Cedar Street</u>. There will be an officer present to direct traffic.
- 3. Show your JWU ID or a photo ID & a negative COVID test.
- 4. Complete check-in verification and sign the roster.
- 5. Receive your key packet and important information regarding residential living.

Saturday, August 27th: The housing check-in process will be located in Parking Lot A. To check-in, you will need to:

- 1. Arrive 15 minutes prior to your registered move-in time.
- 2. Enter the parking lot from West 4th Street.
- 3. Show your JWU ID or a photo ID & a negative COVID test.
- 4. Complete check-in verification and sign the roster.
- 5. Receive your key packet and important information regarding residential living.

Arrival and Unpacking Belongings

After you receive your key packet from the Residential Life staff, you will proceed to the designated unloading zone. You will have 30 minutes to unload your vehicle. Once you have unloaded, you will be directed to the Cedar Street Parking Deck until the conclusion of move-in.

There will be volunteers to assist with unloading your vehicles, so we recommend putting labels on your items so they do not get mixed with other residents' items.

Front Desk:

Each residence hall features a front desk where helpful services are provided. Staff members, Resident Assistants and Desk Assistants welcome guests, answer questions, and assist with safety measures. At the front desk, residents can offer suggestions, register concerns, learn how to submit a work order, inquire about upcoming events, and more. Get to know the staff and know that they are there to help.

Laundry Facilities

Laundry facilities are provided for your convenience in Cedar Halls North and South on each floor. Laundry costs are pay-per-use at the expense of the residents. All machines accept debit and credit cards only.

Don't forget to pack your detergent and other laundry essentials.

Safety & Security

All entrance doors are secured with card readers and cameras. Your JWU ID card will allow access to your assigned residence hall. Please keep your hall secure by meeting your guests at the door and not allowing others to follow you inside upon entering.

Remember to lock the door to your room every time you leave and ensure your suite door is properly closed.

Mail Services

Mailboxes are provided for each student in our residence halls. Each resident will be provided a key which you will need to keep in a safe place. If the key is lost or misplaced, come to the front desk and let us know right away! Students will be charged \$50.00 for replacement mailbox keys.

Do not send mail or packages prior to your move-in date. Residential Life will only accept items for students who have officially checked in and are actively residing in the building.

You will receive your mailbox number on move-in day during the check-in process.

The mailroom will officially open on Monday, August 29th.

CHANGING YOUR ROOM


Room changes can not be considered until move-in has been completed for the semester.

According to Residential Life records, suites are to be occupied only by the person(s) properly assigned to them.

Room changes are permitted after the first three weeks of every semester. This is what is called a three-week moratorium or "housing freeze." Residential Life requires this time period to confirm who resides in each campus residential space and make any necessary administrative moves.

After the three-week period, Residential Life will notify residents via email of the room change process and period for room changes. The Residence Director of the residence hall will review each request to determine if the change is possible.

Please note: Unauthorized room changes (including relocating within the same suite) are considered a violation of the Student Code of Conduct. Students found in violation will be subject to review through the student conduct process and may be required to relocate back to their original assignment.







FOR THE PARENTS

10 Tips for Supporting Your Student

- 1. Encourage students to ask questions and solve problems
- 2. Ask students what they think they should do
- 3. Send positive messages about your pride in their efforts
- 4. Encourage developing new friendships at JWU Charlotte
- 5. Always suggest consulting with a staff person for advice and resources...Have you talked to your RA or RD about it?
- 6. Help your student understand that the Family Educational Rights to Privacy Act (FERPA) does not allow you access to their educational files or to handle situations for them.
- 7. Suggest talking with roommates about problems (in person) as it relates to sharing space
- 8. Encourage your student to get involved in campus events
- 9. Please encourage them to find a great place they feel comfortable studying
- 10. Please encourage them to work toward balance concerning diet, sleep, exercise, and relaxation
